I have known Yajna since 2007 when she started her Masters in Applied Psychology/PhD (Clinical) at Murdoch University, Perth. I was one of her lecturers and clinical supervisors, and supervised her doctoral research which she completed successfully in June 2011. Yajna was endorsed as a Clinical Psychologist in May 2012, and since then I have met her regularly for peer consultations as part of her PD requirements for continuing professional registration.

Yajna was a guest lecturer at Murdoch University during second semester 2012 when she presented a series of lectures on 'Person-Centred' approaches to psychotherapy to 4th year psychology students. Student feedback rated her presentations as well prepared and clearly delivered. She has subsequently presented papers on sections of her research at an international conference on Psychology and education in Portugal and at the Australian Health Promotion National Conference (2009).

Yajna has worked with children and youth at ACTIV Foundation, the WA Dept of Child Protection, Cockburn Community Council with adolescents, and with adults as Project Manager (Trauma) at the Marian Centre, an adult psychiatric hospital in Perth, where she developed a PTSD programme based on group EMDR and ACT principles, trained her team, and collaboratively ran the programme. She has facilitated workshops for nurses and OTs on working with difficult clients and has provided training workshops, lectures and tutorials for 5th Year medical students.

Since 2019, she has run psychodynamic supervision groups with Dr Marc Joffe and has supervised Clinical Psychologists at her private practice on their use of EMDR, Schema Therapy, and Psychodynamic Therapy. She is now an accredited practitioner and EMDR consultant with the EMDR Association of Australia. She is also an accredited psychodynamic supervisor of psychiatry trainees who are required by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (RANZCP) to see a client weekly for 40 sessions and then write a 10,000 word account of their practice. In addition, Yajna is a guest lecturer in trauma and psychodynamic therapy for final year psychiatry trainees with the RANZCP, and she lectures Masters in Clinical Psychology students at Edith Cowan University, Perth.

Yajna is the founder and director of the Clinic of Collaborative Interventions, a private psychology practice where she and her colleagues provide consultations and therapy for clients with personality disorders, PTSD, anxiety and depression, relationship breakdowns, and family dysfunction. Recently, I reviewed her innovative ideas for therapy based on an integration of EMDR and psychodynamic concepts and practices.

In sum, Yajna is a very enthusiastic, highly respected, committed psychologist who has outstanding qualities of empathy and warmth that she combines with academic rigour and excellent therapeutic competencies that are highly valued by her clients, colleagues, and those she teaches and supervises.

I have been impressed by her willingness to accept a broad range of referrals. She appeared keen not only to assess and manage patients who suffer with problems that fall within her areas of subspecialisation, but also eager for the challenge of other complex cases from a wide range of disorders. I know I can rely on Dr Coci to identify appropriate areas for intervention and provide feedback very punctually. I have provided supervision to Yajna since January 2011, initially in conjunction with an innovative group treatment program that she developed at a private hospital, and later from November 2011 when she moved to full-time independent practice. I continue to provide her with individual supervision on a regular basis.

The hospital-based program was a major project for her, undertaken early in her professional career. She read widely, consulted appropriately with local, interstate and international experts, and developed an integrated program that included significant elements of Acceptance and Commitment Therapy and a group application of a simplified EMDR protocol for adults. This latter innovation was a world first.

I am impressed by her willingness to develop her professional skills by seeking supervision well beyond the formal requirements necessary for her registration as a Clinical Psychologist. Already her professional skills are at a level beyond that which would be expected of someone with her experience. She has demonstrated an eagerness to learn, responsiveness to feedback, and a capacity for reflection on her own practice which augurs well for the future.

She enjoys the challenge of working with clients who have more complex and chronic presentations where skills in assessment and formulation are necessary in order to develop an effective treatment plan. In working with such clients she has demonstrated a capacity to engage and form a collaborative relationship that carries the therapeutic work. She draws on a wide range of empirically supported therapies, including CBT, Schema Therapy, Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing, and Acceptance and Commitment Therapy. She has attended training workshops in these therapies. She is currently proceeding with the necessary supervision and training that should see her becoming an accredited Schema Therapist and an accredited EMDR consultant within a year.



To whom it may concern,

I have had direct professional experience with Yajna for approximately 2.5 years beginning in March 2010. At this time I supervised Yajna for about 4 months in my capacity as Clinical Psychologist and Daypatient coordinator at The Marian Centre (TMC), a private mental health hospital. During this period Yajna cofacilitated a number of cognitive-behavioural group programs for adults with Axis I and Axis II diagnoses with myself, and participated in a mindfulness-based cognitive therapy group (MBCT) that I facilitated. I have subsequently worked with Yajna in 2011 as co-facilitator in TMC's new PTSD 2-week group program that Yajna designed, project managed and implemented based on evidence-based practice. To my knowledge, this program was the first in Australia to employ a group-based Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) protocol. Preliminary findings were very positive. I continue to participate in regular peer supervision with Yajna.

My assessment of Yajna over the previous period is that her clinical psychology knowledge in the area of formulation, intervention procedures and theory for adults with Axis I and II disorders is broad and well above the average clinical psychologist level. Yajna is especially knowledgeable and skilled in the area of CBT, schema therapy and EMDR for PTSD and complex presentations. Indeed Yajna provided approximately 5 hours of professional training to myself in regard to the new PTSD/EMDR group protocol she developed. I have also observed her therapy skills during the sessions I co-facilitated with her. She shows particular strengths in relation to: the competent and diligent execution of CBT and schema therapy clinical assessment, formulation, and intervention procedures and processes for clients with complex presentations; CBT/ACT therapy protocol development and therapy manual writing; in developing a therapeutic alliance and empathic attunement to clients with often severe presentations; integrating well in a team environment; shows good leadership, verbal / written communication skill, and project management skill.

Finally, on an interpersonal level, while very focused and conscientious, Yajna can work very flexibly, pleasantly, and cooperatively with her fellow mental health professionals and administrative workers. Overall, I believe Yajna's range of skills, knowledge and attributes in the area of mental health service delivery are highly desirable and of a very high standard.

Congratulations, you have been nominated for a Murdoch teaching award. From 2013, we have introduced some new processes for staff to be nominated to potentially apply for a teaching award.

There are two types of awards:

- · the VC's Citations for Excellence in Enhancing Learning (awarded in semester 1); and
- the VC's Awards for Teaching Excellence (broadly known as TEX Awards awarded in semester 2).

These are based on, and articulate to, the national Office for Learning and Teaching (OLT) Citations and Awards, respectively.

We are now using the same nomination process for both types of awards. We continue to nominate those staff who are in the top 10% of teaching survey results. In addition, we are trialing a system where students can directly nominate staff in their MOSS teaching surveys.

You have been nominated by 5 students through standard Surveys of Teaching. Some students may have written a rationale for your nomination. You will find this at the end of your MOSS Survey of Teaching report. We hope you can use this nomination and any 'testimonials' to good effect in your career progression.

What to do? If you are eligible you can use this nomination to apply for either a citation or an award - whichever is most appropriate for your circumstances. To be eligible you must have worked at Murdoch for at least two years, and if you have previously won this award, you cannot re-apply for a period of five years.

If you decide to proceed, you will need to present a written case of your excellence as a teacher, which will be assessed by the selection committee. For more information, go to http://our.murdoch.edu.au/Educational-Development/VCs-excellence-awards/.
